Israel and sons go to Egypt



Joseph tending flocks (Gen 37)

- With Sons of Bilhah and Zilpah
 - Dan, Naphtali, Gad, Asher
- Joseph 17 years old
- Bad report



Disharmony among brothers

- Joseph was the favorite
 - coat of many colors
- Hated by his brothers



Joseph's dreams

- Sheaves of grain bow
- Sun, moon, eleven stars bow



Joseph sent to his brothers

- Plotted to kill him
- Reuben opposed plan
- > Thrown into cistern



Ishmaelite, Midianite merchants

- Judah proposes selling Joseph
- Sold for 20 shekels of silver
- Joseph taken to Egypt
- Sold to Potiphar, captain of guard



Covering up the deed

- Reuben's distress
- Deception of bloody coat
- Jacob mourns



Judah's sons (Gen 38)

- Er put to death by the Lord
- Onan
 - refused to provide children for his brother's wife
 - put to death by the Lord
- Shelah



Judah withholds Shelah

- Third son should have provided children for Tamar
- Judah feared Shelah would die also
- Tamar lived as a widow



Judah and Tamar

- Tamar poses as prostitute
- Judah offers young goat
- Seal, cord, staff as pledge



Consequences of sin

- Tamar pregnant
- Judah calls for her to be burned
- Seal, cord, staff prove Judah responsible
- Judah humbles himself



Joseph and Potiphar (Gen 39)

- God blessed everything Joseph did
- Placed in charge of Potiphar's house
- God blessed Potiphar's house



Potiphar's wife

- Tried to seduce Joseph daily
- Joseph refuses, cites three reasons:
 - honor (trusted by Potiphar)
 - righteousness (wicked thing)
 - godliness (sin against God)
- Joseph avoided her



Joseph is "set up"

- Joseph doing his duties in house
- Potiphar's wife propositions Joseph
- Grabs coat
- Joseph flees, leaving coat behind



Joseph thrown in prison

- Potiphar's wife accuses Joseph
- Coat as evidence
- Thrown into prison
- God continued to bless Joseph in prison



Cup bearer and Baker

- Thrown into same prison
- Both have dreams
- Joseph interprets them



Cup bearer's dream

- Vine with three branches
- Budded, blossomed, grapes
- Pharaoh's cup

In three days, cup bearer restored

"Remember me"



Baker's dream

- Three baskets of bread on head
- Birds eating bread out of basket

In three days will be hanged



Both dreams fulfilled

But cup bearer forgets Joseph



Pharaoh's dreams (Gen 41)

- Seven fat cows, seven gaunt cows
- Seven healthy heads of grain, seven thin
- Wise men and magicians could not interpret
- Cup bearer remembers Joseph



Joseph interprets dreams

- Seven good years
- Seven years of famine
- Store food during good years
- Appoint wise man in charge



Pharaoh chooses Joseph

"Can we find anyone like this man, one in whom is the spirit of God?"



Joseph appointed ruler of Egypt

"I am Pharaoh, but without your word no one will lift hand or foot in all Egypt."

- From prisoner to ruler in one day!
- At age 30
- 13 years after brothers sold him



Seven years of abundance

- Collected huge quantities of grain
- Stored in cities



Joseph's sons

- Manasseh
 - God made him "forget"
- Ephraim
 - God made him "fruitful"



Seven years of famine

- Worldwide
- Joseph sold grain



Jacob sends sons to Egypt (Gen 42)

- Ten brothers (all but Benjamin)
- They bow to Joseph
- 20 years after he was sold
- Joseph recognizes brothers
- Brothers did not recognize Joseph



Joseph speaks harshly

- Remembers dreams
- Accuses them of spying
- Imprisons them three days
- Simeon kept in prison
- Others sent back with food
- Must return with Benjamin



Brothers return to Jacob

- Find money in sacks
- Fear of retribution

"You have deprived me of my children. Joseph is no more and Simeon is no more, and now you want to take Benjamin. Everything is against me!"



Brothers return to Egypt (Gen 43)

- With Benjamin
 - "if I am bereaved, I am bereaved"
- Judah guarantees Benjamin's safety
- Returning money for previous grain
- Gifts for ruler



Preparations to dine with Joseph

- Received earlier payment
- Presented gifts to Joseph
- Joseph inquired about father
- Joseph left room and wept



Dining with Joseph

- Separate from Egyptians
- Seated in order by age
- Benjamin's portion 5x others



Joseph tests brothers (Gen 44)

- Places money in sacks
- Places cup in Benjamin's sack
- Sends men in pursuit
- Brought back to Joseph



Joseph tries brothers

- Commands Benjamin to remain as slave
- Judah pleads to substitute himself



Joseph reveals identity (Gen 45)

- Sent Egyptians out of room
- Wept loudly
- "I am Joseph"
- Brothers were terrified



Joseph reveals identity

And now, do not be distressed and do not be angry with yourselves for selling me here, because it was to save lives that God sent me ahead of you.



Joseph calls family to Egypt

- Pharaoh is pleased
- Sent carts, ten donkeys, provisions
- Loaded with best things of Egypt "Never mind about your belongings, because the best of all Egypt will be yours."



Brothers tell Jacob

- At first does not believe
- Then becomes convinced
 "I'm convinced! My son Joseph is still alive. I will go and see him before I die."



God speaks to Jacob

I am God, the God of your father," he said. "Do not be afraid to go down to Egypt, for I will make you into a great nation there. I will go down to Egypt with you, and I will surely bring you back again. And Joseph's own hand will close your eyes."



Joseph meets Israel in Goshen

- Emotional reunion
- Arranges for them to live as shepherds in Goshen



Famine continues

- Joseph's family was given food (Gen 47:12)
- Egyptians and Canaanites bought food
- All money, livestock, land exchanged for food
- Pharaoh becomes owner of everything



Manasseh and Ephraim (Gen 48)

- Blessed by Jacob
- Reckoned as Jacob's sons
- Joseph's other sons reckoned under them



Ephraim ahead of Manasseh

- Num 1:33,35
- Joshua descended from Ephraim
 - 1 Chron 7:27
- Jeroboam (first king of northern kingdom) descended from Ephraim
 - 1 King 11:26



Jacob blesses his sons (Gen 49)

- Some blessings, some curses Gen 49:10 The scepter will not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until he comes to whom it belongs and the obedience of the nations is his.
- Heb 11:21



Jacob's death

- Instructions about his burial
- Gen 50 Joseph buries Jacob
- Joseph reassures brothers
- Joseph gives instructions about his bones
- Death of Joseph
