Basic Christianity Series: A Powerful Prayer Life

Lesson by Perry Parks Study Notes 6/9/2011

1. The all-powerful God that Listens.

- a. Ps. 8:3-5
 - i. God designed & sustains a terrifyingly powerful & complex universe with his Word
 - ii. We are small, delicate and easily harmed...yet God wants to interact with us
 - iii. A mighty and gentle God wants to connect with us in prayer

2. The Reward

- a. Ecclesiastes 3:11; Genesis 15:1
 - i. God created us with a hole in our hearts...and eternity only he can fill...he is the reward we seek
 - ii. We try to fill this hole with people and purposes that are not able to fill it...and disappoint ourselves
- b. Philippians 4:6
 - i. A strong prayer life eliminates anxiety, replacing it with a sense of peace that others can't understand
 - ii. Others run around anxious, chasing and protecting the things that fill them up.
 - iii. What will fills you up can never be moved or shaken, so you can be still and peaceful.
- c. The Reward: A Powerful Prayer Life can completely fill you up....and totally anchor you down.

3. The Requirements

These are not arbitrary rules, but the natural path to the reward of a powerful prayer life Apple Trees require: Soil, Water & Sunlight. Any one of these missing = no apples **Requires: Belief, Submission & Humility. Any of them missing means no fill up; no anchor down.**

- a. Belief
 - i. Hebrews 11:1 He says it...you believe it. You must be sure.
 - ii. Hebrews 11:6 The reward is impossible without pleasing him, and you must believe to please.
 - iii. James 1:6; Matt 14:31 Doubt causes us to be tossed by the storm. We lose our anchor in doubt
 - iv. We doubt because we don't understand HOW God may fulfill his promises.
 - v. Hebrews 11:17-19 Abraham did not know how God would fulfill his promise, but believed he would

vi. Do not rely on the understanding of how things work to believe, but on confidence in God.

- b. Submission
 - i. James 2:19 Belief without submission is rebellion...like that of the demons
 - ii. Hebrews 5:7-9 God shows no favoritism. Required total submission even from His Son. He would not hear him without it.
 - iii. Psalm 66:18; Romans 8:7 Treasuring sin keeps our hearts hostile to Him; he won't listen to that.
 - iv. We cannot hold onto our sin and expect the fruit of a Powerful Prayer Life. We must submit.
- c. Humility
 - i. Luke 18: 9-14 Pharisee believed God & submitted to his Law...but lacked Humility
 - ii. It takes courage and sacrifice to believe & submit, but it takes humility to be merciful.
 - iii. Praying without humility is praying in vain.
 - iv. Matthew 9:10-13 Jesus came to save everyone... lack of humility blinded them to their need and savior.
 - v. We cannot be born in or stay in the Kingdom without humility.

4. The Plan to Get What's Missing

- Matt 25:1-13 They were missing what was required, tried to buy/borrow, too late...excluded from God's presence.
- Requirements are not free. You must buy with **TIME**, **EFFORT & FOCUS**, to obtain what you lack.
- Time, effort & Focus are always in use...so you must re-allocate and give something up.
- Once you have chosen what to reallocate...where that focus goes Depends on your weakness
 - a. Belief
 - i. Reallocate to Bible daily Bible Study. You must know what God says in order to believe it
 - ii. KEY: DON'T JUST READ...ALLOCATE TIME TO MEDITIATE on what you've read...this is where the belief comes from.
 - iii. Think of how you might on reasoning like Abraham in Heb11:17-19.

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- iv. Pray on God might fulfill a promise you struggle to believe by focusing on HIS capabilities, not yours.
- b. Submission
 - i. Meditate to have an eternal perspective (2 Corinthians 4:17)
 - ii. Count the cost, but include God's rewards and punishments in the equation (Luke 12:4-5)
 - iii. Fear of God can help overcome fear of the world.
- c. Humility
 - i. 1 Corinthians 15:9-10 Paul meditated on weaknesses to remember God's grace and stay humble.
 - ii. Allow yourself to be sobered by the punishment you SHOULD receive...even for things done today.
 - iii. Hold to the parable of Pharisee & Tax collector (Luke 18:9-14)...and remember what pleased God.

5. The Summary

- a. The Fruit of a powerful pray life fills the hole in us (Eccl 3:11/ Gen15:1)
- b. Anchors us in all situations (Phil 4:6-8)
- c. But it doesn't come by wishing...not Free
- d. It Requires.... Belief, Submission & Humility
 - i. Belief like we see in Heb 11:19 from Abraham
 - ii. Submission we see in (Heb 5:7) from Jesus
 - iii. Humility we see in (Luke 18:9-14) from the Tax collector
- e. We invest Time, Focus & Effort to obtain what we lack.
- f. As we Meditate and imitate these examples and invest, our fulfillment and serenity will grow!
- g. Jeremiah will speak be speaking of us when he says in Jeremiah 17:7-8

But blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, whose confidence is in him.

⁸ He will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream.

It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."
