

Sola Scriptura – Scripture Alone

Sola Gratia – Grace Alone

Sola Fide – Faith Alone


Solus Christus – Christ Alone

Soli Deo Gloria – God's Glory Alone



Luther's Choice – the 5 Solas

- **Sola Scriptura:** Scripture alone is the basis for all church doctrine, belief, and practice.
- **Sola Gratia:** The idea that salvation is by grace alone. The idea that it is an unmerited gift of God based solely on His goodness, not our own.
- **Sola Fide:** The idea that salvation is through faith alone. The idea that faith is a gift bestowed by God.
- **Solus Christus:** The idea that salvation is found in Christ alone.
- **Soli Deo Gloria:** The idea that God saves man for God's glory alone, and that believers are to live our lives to glorify Him alone.

Response to Catholic Church

Council of Trent, 1545 to 1563, Canon 30. *If anyone says that after the reception of the grace of justification the guilt is so remitted and the debt of eternal punishment so blotted out to every repentant sinner, that no debt of temporal punishment remains to be discharged either in this world or in purgatory before the gates of heaven can be opened, let him be anathema.*

Which means? Grace is not sufficient, the Catholic church also required works: they seek to obey the commandments, participate in the sacraments, go to church, do penance and give alms, recite prayers and so on, in order to merit salvation. In its official writings, the Catholic Church teaches that faith is important; but it also insists on the necessity of good works to merit eternal life.

But - we know that grace underlies our entire relationship with God – without grace we have no relationship as sin separates us from God.



For it is by **grace** you have been saved, through faith - and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast. – Eph 2:8-9

... for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,
²⁴and all are justified freely by his **grace** through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. – Rom 3:23-24

And if by grace, then it cannot be based on works; if it were, **grace** would no longer be **grace**. – Rom 11:6



Sola Gratia Grace is Free

We clearly depend “only” on God’s grace, and not our works.

Sola Gratia Grace is Free but not Cheap

Response to Catholic Church

Council of Trent, 1545 to 1563, Canon 12. *If anyone says that justifying faith is nothing else than confidence in divine mercy, which remits sins for Christ's sake, or that it is this confidence alone that justifies us, let him be anathema.*

Which means? Official Catholic teaching would not allow the sinner to rely by faith on the mercy of God or to believe that his sins are forgiven for Christ's sake only. Something more is required. You must keep yourself justified by your own good works.

But - we know that grace comes through faith:

For it is by grace you have been saved, **through faith** - and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast. – Eph 2:8-9

And **without faith it is impossible to please God**, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.— Heb 11:6

For it is with your heart that you **believe and are justified**, and it is with your mouth that you **profess your faith and are saved** – Rom 10:10

So in Christ Jesus you are all **children of God through faith**, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ – Gal 3:26-27

In the same way, **faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.** – James 2:17

For this very reason, make every effort to **add to your faith** goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love. – 2 Pet 1:5-7

Sola Fide's Impact

Luther's key insight was that salvation was by faith alone. He wasn't the first or the only one to realize that, but because he was a brilliant writer, speaker and publicist, and the printing press was now available, his books and pamphlets spread very quickly. It's not up to the Pope or his ministers to forgive sins, he said – we trust God and we are saved.


In the Church of the day, forgiveness was obtained through doing penance – acts of charity, prayers, or self-punishment that were supposed to reinforce an inward repentance and were inseparable from it.

He realized that salvation wasn't about what we do, but about what Christ has done.

This was radical because it cut out the middle man. **Anyone, without the intervention of a priest, could repent and be saved.**

I believe we can take **God's Word** as supreme in our lives.


The **Scripture** can then teach us of God's **grace** and build our **faith**.
